Important Information before Proceeding: Requests for reconsideration are reviewed based on two sets of policies — institutional aid policies and, for US citizens and eligible non-citizens, federal aid regulations. For Princeton's institutional aid, limited circumstances are eligible for reconsideration. For federal aid, all reasonable circumstances are considered. High vacation costs, large credit card debt, and standard living expenses like mortgage payment, utilities, car payment, etc. are not considered special circumstances. All situations are reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Submission of a Request for Reconsideration Form does not guarantee a change to aid eligibility.

Instructions: Please complete and upload this form and appropriate supporting documentation via the "other" document upload link in the <u>My Financial Aid portal</u> for currently enrolled students, the <u>financial aid portal</u> for applicants, or the secure <u>Financial Aid Document Upload</u> for non-custodial parents of a student or applicant.

The request for reconsideration will not be reviewed until all supporting documentation, as listed below for each category, is received. Upon receipt of a completed application, the Financial Aid Office may request additional documentation. Please submit documents as quickly as possible to avoid delays. You will be notified if there is an adjustment to your aid offer.

This request, including the required supporting documentation is only for the 2025–26 academic year. To be considered for aid in subsequent years, you will need to submit all requirements as outlined on our website. The PFAA for the 2026–27 academic year will be available in March 2026.

Most recent paystub, severance statement, and unemployment income, if applicable. *We require that the final 2025 tax return be submitted to Undergraduate Financial Aid by March 15, 2026.
